

How to pronounce Italian - a few basics

- Italian isn't hard to pronounce for English speakers.
 You need to know a few basic rules.
- Italian ci and ce are both pronounced like the English 'chi, che'. In cia, cio, ciu the 'i' is not pronounced, so i sounds like 'cha, cho, chu'.

. chi and che are pronounced like the hard English 'k':

 gi and ge have a soft sound, like the 'j' in 'Jim'. In gia, gio, giu the 'i' is not pronounced, so it sounds like 'ja, jo, ju':
